he may fancy or even a cast similar to those which a crack may be using and if he catches one for every three the other has he may consider himself very lucky of course there are lochs where the fish are not abundant and a beginner may come across as many as an older fisher but we speak of lochs where there are fish to be caught and where each has a fair chance again it is said that the boatman has as much to do with catching trout in a loch as the angler well we dont deny that in an untried loch it is necessary to have the guidance of a good boatman but the same argument holds good as to stream fishing
