an eye witness of exceptional value of all the events of the russian revolution is robert wilton the russian correspondent of the times for seventeen years born in england but educated in russia he knew russia like a russian during the war thi correspondent of the times on one occasion in 1916 took command of a section of the russian army of which the officers had been wounded and behaved with such gallantry that he was decorated with the cross of st george it was the first time that this exclusively military distinction had been conferred upon a civilian in the foreword to his french book les derniers jours des romanof from which i am about to quote robert wilton says that in order to ensure the accuracy of the work he himself translated from russian into french the official reports and original documents confirming his narrative i have done all in my power he adds to act as an impartial chronicler the list of names of the rulers of russia in 1918 which i am about to quote is taken from pages 136 137 of this painstaking french study of the russian bolshevik revolution it is a noteworthy fact that this list is not to be found in the english edition of the same work the last days of the romanovs published in september 1920 by thornton butterworth pope pius xi wrote as follows in the encyclical letter divini redemptoris for them the peoples of the soviet union we cherish the wannest paternal affection we are well aware that not a few of them groan beneath the yoke imposed on them by men who in very large part are strangers to the real interests of the country we recognise that many others were deceived by fallacious hopes we blame only the system with its authors and abettors who considered russia the best field for experimenting with a plan elaborated years ago and who from there continue to spread it from one end of the world to the other in this pamphlet i have outlined some of the historical evidence which goes to prove that those strangers to the real interests of russia who are experimenting with this marxian plan elaborated years ago are members of the jewish nation and that communism is the latest and up to the present the most decadent materialistic phase of the opposition of that nation to the supernatural messias a statement made by stalin at a session of the third international or comintem in moscow in may 1938 makes this manifest the revival of revolutionary action on any scale sufficiently vast said the muscovite figure head will not be possible unless we succeed in utilising the existing disagreements between the capitalistic countries so us to precipitate them against each other into armed conflict the doctrine of marx engels lenin teaches us that all war truly generalised should terminate automatically by revolution the essential work of our party comrades in foreign countries conflicts then in facilitating the provocation of such a conflict those who do not comprehend this know nothing of revolutionary marxism i hope that you will remind the comrades those of you who direct the work the decisive hour will arrive in the splendid encyclical letter on the condition of the church in german march 14th 1937 pope pius xi said that the first and obvious duty the priest owes to the world about him is service to the truth the whole truth the unmasking and refutation of error in whatever form or disguise it conceals itself

russian monarchs have long been regarded as majestic and despotic ruling over mute and servile subjects in a vast empire isolated from the rest of the european continent challenging this view Cynthia H Whittaker uncovers a political dialogue about the nature and limitations of monarchy in eighteenth century russia an interchange that took place between rulers and writers under the influence of western and central european enlightenment thinking roughly 250 authors participated in this public discourse on monarchical power producing more than 500 publications and official pronouncements on monarchy beginning with Peter the Great Russian rulers shifted the foundation for legitimacy from its religious underpinnings to a secular basis as notions of a monarch s duty to reform began to replace divine right as the justification for absolute power during the recurring crises of succession in the eighteenth century monarchs sought further legitimacy and celebrated their election by the people that is key members of the elite writers in turn engaged rulers in public discussion via the printed word as they examined monarchical legitimacy and debated its feasibility with sophisticated arguments drawn from the arsenal of classical and current european ideas intended for the eyes of both the sovereign and the educated elite publications in nearly every genre contained didactic passages explaining proper conduct for a monarch writers also warned of the dire consequences awaiting the ruler who did not abide by these accepted standards of behavior and in the course of the century three monarchs lost the throne Russian monarchy shows how this eighteenth century dialogue between elites and their monarchs revolutionized the concept of rule and gave writers a role in shaping their political environment

discusses the myths and legends surrounding the two rulers includes passages from Catherine s memoirs and letters she wrote to contemporaries like Voltaire and Diderot includes pictures depicting Peter Catherine and important people places and events in their lives includes a bibliography of both leaders for further reading for anyone trying to understand the origins of modern Russia the search should begin with Tsar Peter I 1672 1725 who titled himself Peter the Great during his lifetime the moniker is fitting considering the manner in which Peter brought Russia out of the middle ages and into the 18th century through a series of campaigns Peter turned Russia into a formidable empire that would subsequently become a major force on the European continent while also emulating Western Europe and turning Russia into an international state that interacted with the other continental powers by revolutionizing and modernizing Russian arms including the creation of Russia s first naval force Peter was able to pursue an aggressive and expansionist foreign policy that set the stage for the way the European map would be redrawn again and again over the coming centuries perhaps more remarkably as Peter was stretching Russia s borders he was transforming Russia from the inside as well fond of the cultures to the west Peter embraced technology science and the arts developing a new educational system for his people and supporting a number of institutions of higher learning in Russia he built a European style capital at St Petersburg and also established new ports and access to the Baltic Sea for the purposes of opening up trade with the west as one of the most famous women rulers in history Russian Empress Catherine the Great has long been remembered not only as one of the most powerful women of her time but she was also one of the most powerful and capable rulers in all of Europe and her path to the throne was just as remarkable as her reign in a story that sounds like it could have been a precursor to Cinderella Catherine the Great was born into a family of minor nobility but she managed to forge her own destiny through her own cunning use of diplomacy and intrigue gradually gaining allies and power by 1762 she confident enough to conspire against her own husband Peter III whose reign as Tsar lasted just six months before his arrest at the hands of his wife upon his arrest and death Catherine took power as the regent for their son Grand Duke Paul despite the strong arm tactics Catherine came to power in the midst of the enlightenment which was flourishing in France and Britain and she would rule as an enlightened ruler a known correspondent of Voltaire s Catherine sought to modernize Russia and turn it into a force in its own right creating a rich and cultured court at the same time over the course of nearly 35 years in power Catherine ushered in the Russian enlightenment and presided over a period of time known as the golden age of the Russian empire given her length of reign forceful character and lasting legacy it was inevitable that legends about Catherine the Great would also pop up in the wake of her death to an extent certain legends have overshadowed her actual accomplishments even as they continue to be circulated Peter the Great Catherine the Great addresses the lives and legends of the two rulers explaining how they turned Russia into a major player on the European scene along with pictures of important people places and events you will learn about Peter the Great and Catherine the Great like you never have before
