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The Blue Sky Boys 2018-02-20

during the 1940s country music was rapidly evolving from traditional songs and string band styles to honky tonk western swing and bluegrass via radio records and film the blue sky boys brothers bill 1917 2008 and earl 1919 1998 bolick resisted the trend preferring to perform folk and parlor songs southern hymns and new compositions that enhanced their trademark intimacy and warmth they were still in their teens when they became professional musicians to avoid laboring in depression era north carolina cotton mills their instantly recognizable style was fully formed by 1936 when even their first records captured soulful harmonies accented with spare guitar and mandolin accompaniments they inspired imitators but none could duplicate the blue sky boys emotional appeal or their distinctive catawba county accents even their last records in the 1970s retained their unique magical sound decades after other country brother duets had come and gone in this absorbing account dick spottswood combines excerpts from bill bolick s numerous spoken interviews and written accounts of his music life and career into a single narrative that presents much of the story in bill s own voice spottswood reveals fascinating nuggets about broadcasting recording and surviving in the 1930s world of country music he describes how the growing industry both aided and thwarted the bolick brothers career and how world war ii nearly finished it the book features a complete extensively annotated list of blue sky boys songs an updated discography that includes surviving unpublished records and dozens of vintage photos and sheet music covers

Sublime Blue 2013

neruda once suggested that his words be poured like wine into the glasses of other languages here is just such a communion noted american poet william pitt root brings us poems from the first of neruda s three collections of odes odas elementales 1954 in his introduction root praises neruda s form with its phrases that fall like thin wrists of water cascading from great heights exploding at intervals against ledges and obstacles protruding from a sheer cliff face fluent sinuous riddled with delightful surprise the offhand form is also suited to the tone of seemingly casual surmise that can so suddenly pool in a conclusion of great clarity and depth here are poems addressed to hope and gloom to numbers and to the atom to blue flowers and artichokes this is neruda at his finest book jacket

The Spanish Blue Division on the Eastern Front, 1941-1945 2022-03-31

in 1941 the franco regime established the spanish division of volunteers to take part in the russian campaign as a unit integrated into the german wehrmacht recruited by both the fascist party falange and the spanish army around 47 000 spanish volunteers joined what would become known as the blue division the spanish blue division on the eastern front 1941 1945 explores an intimate history of the blue division from below using personal war diaries letters and memoirs as well as official documents from military archives in spain germany britain and russia in addition to describing the spanish experience on the eastern front xosé m núñez seixas takes on controversial topics including the blue division s proximity to the holocaust and how members of the blue division have been remembered and commemorated addressing issues such as the behaviour of the spaniards as occupiers their perception by the russians their witnessing of the holocaust their commitment to the war aims of nazi germany and their narratives on the war after 1945 this book illuminates the experience of spanish combatants and occupied civilians
