imaginative play and story telling occupy key roles in children s psychological development and socialization bringing together leading contributors this volume explores what play and story mean to young children and how these vital aspects of development can best be supported in child care and educational settings vital connections are drawn between children s activities their interpersonal relationships and their emerging cognitive and affective capacities topics covered include promoting social play in the classroom storytelling and literacy development and the influences of early caregiving experiences on attachment and learning theoretical and methodological issues in these areas of research are also addressed as well as social policy implications the book is inspired by the work of greta g fein the pioneering teacher researcher and child care policymaker who has contributed an integrative concluding chapter

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the story during a college sexual encounter the girl in nick s bed wants to know why his abdomen is covered in scars does nick tell the truth or does he do what he does so well weave an elaborate tale the question launches him into a memory a children like to play they get all sorts of benefits from playing they get the most benefit from play when they are in control of what they are doing yet there are lots of circumstances today that mean children are not able to control their own play and that s where playwork comes in where the role of the playworker is to create environments that enable children to take control of their playing this book aims to explore the similarities differences and tensions that exist between play and playwork including appropriate definitions and the conflict around the role of the adult fraser brown proposes a play to playwork continuum where playing can be considered a developmental and evolutionary activity and playwork a compensatory activity helpfully structured around the aspects considered by the author as most important for playwork this book uses 101 fascinating stories of children playing to illuminate a range of play and playwork theories the rich array of powerful stories drawn from the casebooks of eminent and experienced playworkers speak for themselves whilst at the same time triggering theoretical explorations that are interwoven with the stories in each chapter mesmerizing absorbing and original this is essential reading for playwork students and practitioners as well as for students and practitioners of early years childhood children s health and wellbeing and children s social care provides information about a wide range of curricular issues affecting elementary and high school education exploring methodological and conceptual issues looking at the forces that shape the curriculum studying the impact of the curriculum on special groups of students and discussing conventional subjects like reading and math
