on november 3 1944 a barely two year toddler named eva was branded prisoner a 26959 in auschwitz she survived the tattooing and countless other shocks born on december 19 1942 in nováky slovakia in a labor camp for jews eva and her parents imrich and agnes were imprisoned in this labor camp until their deportation to auschwitz just before their arrival there several thousand mothers and their children were gassed but these murders suddenly stopped with the rapidly advancing soviet army agnes pregnant with her second child and eva were both liberated on january 27 1945 remaining in the camp eva's sister nora was born in late april shortly afterwards agnes hecht brought her two little girls back to her home in trencín in western slovakia although suffering frequent flare ups of the illnesses she had in auschwitz and recurring nightmares eva did well at school and went on to study medicine at university in bratislava in 1966 she married a fellow holocaust survivor who resettled in munich germany and in 1967 eva moved to west germany to join him and start her practice as a pediatrician and later as a psychotherapist every so often the horror of her early years would resurface in nightmares of the auschwitz gas chambers and dead babies having achieved prominence as a pediatrician child therapist and international speaker eva umlauf decided to finally tell her story in 2016 at the age of seventy four with the assistance of journalist stefanie oswalt eva published *die nummer auf deinem unterarm ist blau wie deine augen* erinnerungen hoffmann und campe verlag in 2023 the german edition was beautifully translated into english by shelley frisch under the title *the number on your forearm is blue like your eyes* this poignant and riveting memoir brings alive eva's family history and offers a unique perspective on a horrifying era by someone who experienced its effects from infancy while also exploring the emotional legacies of trauma

the diary of eva beresin's mother sári erdélyi which she wrote in the days following her liberation from auschwitz concentration camp becomes the center of gravity for an artistic endeavor 00 my family

has treasured this small auburn copy containing my mother's faded handwriting for as long as i can remember the irresistible wish to make those lines legible once again did not surface until after her death in 2007 sometime during the winter of 2012 it grabbed me and i immersed myself in it touching her writings witnessing the movement of my hands as i retraced her faded letters which had almost disappeared into the paper's texture soon became more important than reconstructing their content eventually i discovered some photographs which were taken after 1943 and showed her before her deportation to auschwitz when her world still intact i translated these black and white photographs into paintings using colors that were present in my imagination eva beresin's paintings depict portraits and scenes from her mother's happy days before the germans invaded hungary in 1944 and her subsequent deportation to auschwitz by contrast the diary entries do not begin until the end of world war ii the cover shows a design her mother drafted made while studying in budapest beresin's works reveal that the imagination perception and mimesis are tangible and powerful forces in finding answers to the ineffable

eva heyman es para la ciudad de oradea lo que ana frank es para Ámsterdam y el mundo dos adolescentes judías cada una de las cuales escriben y mantienen un diario mientras que el mundo estaba cambiando a raíz de la ocupación nazi ambas murieron en un campo de concentración eva en auschwitz y ana en bergen belsen pero los dos diarios son muy diferentes el diario de eva es corto pero muy intenso no vivió escondida como ana vivió el día a día de la ciudad y la deshumanización que poco a poco va sufriendo su familia y ella misma un proceso lento hacia el infierno sin embargo ana frank es mundialmente conocida y la historia de eva se presenta ahora por primera vez en español con una franqueza y emotividad que llegarán a todos los lectores hay libros que nos cambian hay que dejarse transformar por ellos no se es la misma persona tras leer el pequeño diario de eva leyéndolo tiene una la sensación de devolverle la vida a eva y en cierto modo es así elvira lindo cómo tantos adolescentes eva heyman empezó a escribir su diario secreto y personal el día de su aniversario hacía trece años era el 13 de febrero de 1944 en oradea húngria dejó de escribir cuatro meses después el 30 de mayo de 1944 es realmente muy poco tiempo pero estos pocos meses nos presentan de manera concentrada todo el dramatismo el recorrido que millones de personas hicieron en aquellos mismos años en toda europa el recorrido que va entre una vida aparentemente normal festiva un aniversario unos regalos una familia unas esperanzas unos sueños los primeros enamoramientos y las puertas mismas del infierno eva deja de escribir en el preciso momento en el que la vienen a buscar en un camino que pasará por su deportación en polonia el 3 de junio la llegada a auschwitz el 6 de junio y la muerte en el campo después de ser seleccionada por mengele el 17 de octubre del mismo año vicens villatoro
