yemen is justly famed as one of the world s most dramatically beautiful countries seen in the yemen brings the people architecture and landscapes of this ancient culture alive to the reader through the medium of the author s remarkable black and white photographs taken in the 1970s and here reproduced in duotone his book is also a tribute to one of the most famous of all arab and asian travellers the late dame freya stark 1893 1993 in the mid 1970s at the age of eighty three she made two visits to the author who was then serving in sana a their travels together through north yemen marked the start of a long friendship the volume is also designed to emulate freya stark s earlier classic seen in the hadhramaut published by john murray in 1938 beginning with reminiscences of dame freya the author recalls the time they spent together in yemen her musings on the past and their

mutual devotion to leica cameras he goes on to give a brief account of yemen's history and geography and describes his adventurous rediscovery of the remaining ancient jewish community around sa dah in the far north all this is brought alive in his extraordinary images taken on his own wanderings and also on journeys with dame freya and other noted arabian travellers such as wilfred thesiger and dame violet dickson the prints are introduced by a short description of those notable 1930s screw thread leica cameras used by so many early explorer photographers yemen today like the rest of arabia is undergoing rapid and inevitable change and at the time of writing is much in the news this book records a time when town and country had only recently embarked on the decades of upheaval and much was visually unchanged the author's artistic eye imparts an unforgettable aura of romance and nostalgia to his pictures which like freya stark s will cast their spell over readers present and future

born in paris 1893 a precocious and tough freya stark spent her childhood wondering across europe speaking three languages by the time she was five she became one of the twentieth century s most remarkable and inspirational women renowned for her flamboyant and unorthodox behaviour freya was also self disciplined courageous and remained fearlessly independent throughout her life as an explorer she was unconventional always travelling alone without money or support her expeditions in persia and the hadhramaut during the thirties established her reputation not only as a great traveller and writer but also as a geographer historian and archaeologist caroline moorehead brilliantly captures freya s extraordinary and eventful life that was tempered by a constant struggle against ill health and loneliness in this compelling biography

fluent in at least seven languages and a writer of ravishing prose accounts of her journeys freya stark was one of the great travel writers of the twentieth century in 1934 her first book valley of the assassins was hailed as a classic and t e lawrence pronounced stark a gallant creature a remarkable person it marked the start of a dazzling career as a writer explorer and official diplomat which led stark to explore ancient trading routes in the yemeni desert crusaders castles in syria uncharted regions of arabia and alexander the great s path through turkey often travelling alone through dangerous and uncomfortable territories once having to be airlifted to safety by the raf during the second world war she worked for the foreign office in baghdad and cairo and made an ill fated tour of america for the ministry of information she married late and unwisely but continued to travel and write well into old age going to the himalayas aged 89 and lived to be 100 leaving a legacy of over thirty volumes of travel writings autobiography and letters her life reads like an adventure story imbued with the captivating spirit of the east jane geniesse s ebullient yet touching account of stark s life uncovers the complexity and charm surrounding someone who was both hugely feted and yet repeatedly disappointed in her private life a romantic a complete original and an inspiration to those who followed

in 1934 freya stark encouraged by her recent awards from the royal geographical and royal central asian societies set out to explore the incense road in arabia the magnificent canyons of wadi hadhramaut stretching for 350 miles inland from the coast inspired dame freya to produce some of her best photographs the fortified cities with their mud brick skyscrapers and luscious palm groves perched along the valley beneath towering cliffs are amongst the most visually stunning sights in the world this once rich region home to the queen of sheba and made prosperous as a trading route between india and europe was by then part of the aden protectorate under british rule but very little of the country had been explored by westerners dame freya s particular empathy with local people speaking their own language resulted in charming pictures of people she worked or travelled with and the homes and costumes of the period she travelled in the country twice during the 1930s and both times was forced to leave due to illness however her pictures of aden mukalla and shibam are exceptional in evoking traditional life in this fertile region of arabia during the second world war she returned to aden and was sent by the ministry of information to counter italian influence in the neighbouring kingdom of yemen armed only with her charm and a primitive cinema projector she helped persuade the legendary imam vahva to keep his country out of war forty years later at the age of 83 she returned to north yemen revisiting some of the places she remembered most fondly

freya stark first journeyed to iraq in 1927 seven years after the establishment of the british mandate the modern state was in its infancy and worlds apart from the country it has since become during her many years in iraq freya stark was witness to the rise and fall of the british involvement in the country as well as the early years of independence typically and controversially she chose to live outside the close knit western expatriate scene and immersed herself in the way of life of ordinary iragis living in the native quarter of the city and spending time with its tribal sheikhs and leaders venturing out of baghdad she travelled to mosul nineveh tikrit and najaf where she perceptively describes the millennia old tensions between sunni and shi a time not having dissipated their hatred in the 1940s she returned again this time travelling south to the marsh arabs whose way of life has now all but disappeared north into kurdistan and later kuwait in the days before the oil boom painting a portrait of both the political and social preoccupations of the day as exquisitely as she does the people and landscapes of iraq baghdad sketches is a remarkable portrait of the country as it once was

freya stark traveled the difficult and often dangerous journey from kabul to kandahar and herat in search of one of afghanistan s most celebrated treasures the minaret of djam this magnificent symbol of the powerful ghorid empire that once stretched from iran to india lies in the heart of central afghanistan s wild ghor province surrounded by over 6 000 foot high mountains and by the remains of what many believe to have been the lost city of turquoise mountain one of the greatest cities of the middle ages djam is even today one of the most inaccessible and remote places in afghanistan when freya stark traveled there few people in the world had ever laid eyes on it or managed to reach the desolate valley

the hadhramis of yemen have migrated for centuries in large numbers establishing a diaspora that extends around the indian ocean saudi arabia and the other gulf states this migration has deeply affected the host countries as well as hadhramaut itself yet the region has not been able to use its population size capabilities or resources to wield significant political influence in successive yemeni regimes this book examines the people of the hadhrami diaspora who travelled as religious scholars traders labourers and soldiers to understand their enduring influence and identity in doing so the book explores key aspects of their history including the impact of yemeni nationalist movements the significance of land reforms the importance of social and tribal origins and how the hadhrami resisted european domination as a muslim community although a distinctive part of geographical vemen hadhramaut was not regarded as a vemeni political entity until the twentieth century this research asks if the recent turmoil in vemen following the arab spring the growth of al ga ida and isis and war involving a coalition led by saudi arabia will produce even greater instability in the region or perhaps lead to a united yemen a restored south yemen or even to hadhramaut as an independent state
